The Language Teacher ensures a safe learning environment that guides and encourages participants to develop and reach their full potential pertaining to the language. The incumbent will exhibit a passion for the language and will consistently endeavor to improve upon its delivery and instruction through the development of curriculum, resources, policies, and teaching materials that supports n̓eʔkepmx and syilx culture and values at SCFSS and in our communities.
